

Race for the Cure funds abortion service

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My mother, a Rock Island native, died of breast cancer June 10, 1977. She was 42, the age I am now. I intended to sign up for the Quad-Cities Race for the Cure in her memory, which falls on the 29th anniversary of her death. Then I discovered its link to Planned Parenthood.

In honor of Mom, I am writing this letter. Mom was very vocal about her beliefs. She would call radio talk shows and write her Congressmen. She was critical of charities that abused money entrusted to them and would be appalled that the Susan G. Komen Foundation provides grants locally and nationally to Planned Parenthood.

Locally, money from the Race was given to Planned Parenthood in 2004 for Muscatine residents. For 2005 and 2006, they played a shell game. Planned Parenthood wrote grant requests for Louisa County Health, which then passed the funds to Planned Parenthood.

Planned Parenthood makes money by persuading people to kill their unborn children. It does not educate their victims on the lifelong physical and emotional repercussions of their decision.

The Susan G. Komen Foundation alleges funds are to be used for screening, not abortion services (another shell game), and it tries to discredit studies that show a link between abortion and breast cancer.

If you have any doubt about the relationship between the foundation and Planned Parenthood, I encourage you to research it on the Web.

As of 2006, eight medical organizations recognize that abortion raises a woman's risk for breast cancer, independently of the risk of delaying the birth of a first child (a secondary effect that all experts already acknowledge). There have been 4 decades of study on this topic with over 2 dozen studies supporting the link, 16 of which are statistically significant. If this isn't at least cause for pause and a call for more research, I don't know what is! I have heard panicked news reports about not eating fried potatoes or grilled food for fear of carcinogens and cancer...based on just 1 study! If I have to give up my grilled chicken and French fries based on a single study, why can't women be advised to pause and reconsider having an abortion based on over 2 dozen studies showing that abortion may ultimately kill her? Why should those trying to get this information to women be mocked and demonized? I can understand the desire to suppress this information by the abortion industry...it is bad for business. PPFA had combined revenues in 2004 of more than three-quarters of a billion dollars, with \$35 million in "excess" funds. (Planned Parenthood's own statistics.) And to say PPFA offers good services, not just abortion, and they should be funded by Komen, is like having the American Lung Association and the American Cancer Society fund Philip Morris! "The race for the cure is a Great Event... Why is it when Abortion supporters are faced with facts the many go into hysteria? Here are some other facts on Maternal Death Rates: The maternal mortality is defined in this analysis as death by any reason within 12 months following an ending of a pregnancy. Due to privacy laws this analysis cannot occur in the United States. The data chosen from Finland. Finland is a state with liberal abortion laws and with socialized medicine. Their socialized medical records are stored in central databases for analysis by STAKES the Finnish equivalent of the CDC. The age adjusted death rate of non-pregnant women is included in the study for comparison. The study is large (9184 maternal deaths) over the period seven years. Data is always subject to statistical variation from year to year, country to country, study to study. For this reason, the researchers also reported what is known as "95 percent confidence intervals." This means that the available data indicates that 95 percent of all similar studies would report a finding within a specified range around the actual reported figure. For example, the .50 odds ratio for childbirth has a confidence interval of .32 to .78. In other words, it is probable that 95 percent of the time, the odds ratio of death following childbirth will be found to be between 32 percent and 78 percent of the non-pregnant woman rate. The 95 percent confidence interval for the odds ratio of death following abortion was reported to be 1.27 to 2.42 of the annual rate for non-pregnant women. With a 95% confidence, it can be stated that abortion maternal mortality is higher than both birth or miscarriage. In 1990 it is estimated that over 1400 women died following a legalized abortions with the majority of these deaths resulting from suicide, homicide or accident. Abortion related maternal deaths are calculate to be 10 times higher than reported deaths caused from complications due to illegal abortion as reported to the CDC in 1972. I estimate that in the United States between 1970-2005 that 12,000 maternal deaths have occurred as compared if the mother had given birth or had a miscarriage. In the years following WOE v. WADE there have been an estimated 45,000,000 children that have died from abortion. Data sources: STAKES data mortality rates (deaths per 100,000) of 27 birth, 48 miscarriage and 101 legal abortion, CDC 1970 total reported deaths of 39 per year from illegal abortions, estimated 45,000,000 actual abortions from 1970 to 2005.)"
